

# Do YOU know where your children are?

A Newcastle Partnership guide for parents to help prevent anti-social behaviour

If you have children under the age of 18 please help us by considering this important advice:

Before they go out, find out **WHERE** your children are going, **WHAT** they will be doing, **WHO** they will be with - and **WHEN** they will be home.

Sometimes, children do not consider the consequences of their actions; ask them to think before they act and consider whether they are putting themselves and others at risk, or doing things that could damage property/harm the environment.

Studies show that children do not often buy alcohol from shops as they can get it from home without their parents' knowledge. Remember to store alcohol in a safe place - and keep a check on how much you have so you will know if any goes missing.

Young people are often the victims of crime and anti-social behaviour (ASB). If your child experiences either, please contact the Police.
